Our School Street trial launches on Monday 23 May

I am pleased to announce that **Meon Infant and Meon Junior Schools** have been selected to be part of Portsmouth City Council's School Streets trial. Ahead of this we would like to invite you to find out more at our School Streets online open evening.

This is an exciting opportunity that I believe will reduce traffic and congestion on Shelford Road and Crofton Road making it safer for our pupils, reducing vehicle noise and making the air we all breathe cleaner.

What is a School Street?

This is when a road or roads outside a school allows parents, carers and pupils to safely walk and cycle during pick up and drop off times. Portsmouth City Council (PCC) will temporarily restrict access for non-essential motor vehicles under a Temporary Traffic Regulation Order which will be advertised on the School Street ahead of the trial.

During a School Street, access is always available for residents and business premises on the street, emergency services, school transport, blue badge holders, carers of residents who live in the street and people with specific requirements that have been pre-agreed with the head teacher.

How will our School Street work?

The School Street will operate twice a day for approximately 45 minutes between 8.15 and 9am and 2.40 and 3.30pm. The removable barrier will be managed by stewards wearing high vis jackets at the junction of Meon Road and Shelford Road, and at the junction of Locksway Road and Crofton Road, which will temporarily restrict access to all but essential vehicles. Any drivers allowed into the area will be asked to travel at a walking pace to ensure children's safety.

You are invited to join Jennifer Jones (Sustrans) and Natalia Luszczyk (PCC) for an online School Streets open evening on Monday 14 March between 6 and 7pm. During the session you can find out more about School Streets and how it will work for Meon Schools. Why are we taking part in the trial?

We believe a School Street creates a safer route to school and a cleaner environment for everyone. Research has shown that pupils who walk and cycle to school are more alert and ready to start the day than those who travel by car, and the health and mental wellbeing of our pupils is important. Alongside Portsmouth City Council's trial, we will continue to encourage cycling, walking and scooting so that pupils gain the health and social benefits associated with active travel.
