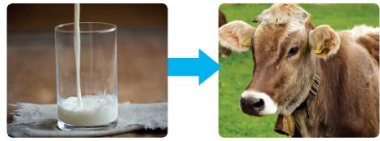


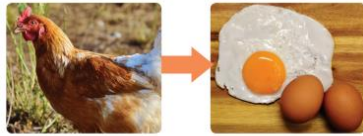
Where does our food come from?

Chickens lay eggs.



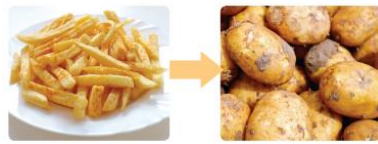
Tomato sauce is made from tomatoes.

Lamb comes from lambs.





Chips come from potatoes.

Where does fruit come from?





Fruit grows on trees, bushes and plants. Some fruits need hot weather to grow, such as mangoes, oranges and pineapples. So, they grow in hot countries. Other fruits, such as apples, pears and plums, do not need hot weather. These are fruits that can be grown in the UK.

Vegetables

Where do vegetables come from?

Vegetables grow on plants and underground.



Some vegetables grow above ground and others grow underground. Potatoes, beetroots, carrots and turnips all grow underground. Beans, cabbages, lettuces, cauliflower and broccoli all grow above ground.

Catching food

Most of the fish we eat, we have to catch; we catch fish in the sea, such as crab and haddock as well fish in rivers and lakes, for example salmon and trout.



Rearing food

Animals that are born with the purpose to provide food.

There are many different breeds of animals which are reared, each with their own features/qualities.



Growing food

Food is grown in an environment where light, food (soil) and water are available to them so they can grow and photosynthesise.
